EXPERIENCE

It goes without saying that this is the most important part of a technical resume.

Detail your past work experience as it relates to the role you're targeting. Keep in mind these do's and don'ts:

DO

- Starting from your most recent job, list all work you've done that directly relates to your target job, including languages, frameworks, tools, etc.
- Emphasize your personal contributions to projects: features, libraries, neat little gems, etc. that you personally owned.
- Use specific "active" verbs that highlight your role in projects you've worked on (ex: managed, developed, built, architected).
- Use brief, concise bulleted lists: 4 - 5 items under your most recent role, and 2 - 3 items under earlier roles.

DON'T

- List work experience that required skills unrelated to the job you want.
- Make it difficult to pick out your personal contributions to the projects by using "we" or "my team."
